



MISSOURI PUBLIC OPINION

Survey conducted February 9 – February 10, 2015. 747 likely voters participated in the survey. Survey weighted to match expected turnout demographics for the 2016 General Election. Margin of Error is +/- 3.6%. Totals do not always equal 100% due to rounding. Survey conducted by Remington Research Group on behalf of Missouri Alliance for Freedom.

Q: Do you support Medicaid expansion in Missouri to comply with Obamacare?

Yes.....41%

No.....47%

Don't know.....12%

Q: Would you be more likely or less likely to support Medicaid expansion if you know it would jeopardize funding for schools, public safety, and transportation?

More likely.....23%

Less likely.....40%

Would you support or oppose this legislation knowing that it is part of Medicaid expansion under Obamacare?
